They were nominated for a few awards as well. Roboken then competed in the NJ state championship where they scored second seed in their division which allowed them to be a captain for finals. They made their way through the bracket only losing in division finals. They were just a two spots below advancing to worlds! They had an incredible season! We applaud them and their leader Chris Kunkel for their talent, dedication and hard work.

Lower School/Middle School Report

On Tuesday, February 26, Lower School teachers visited Elysian Charter School. Teachers had the opportunity to observe classes and speak with staff about their instructional program.
