4.<u>Report from K-12 Executive Director</u>

The 2015-2016 lottery will be held Thursday, January 15, 2015. We have the highest number of applications in school history with 658 applicants for the lottery and an additional 12 reserve pool applicants.

Marti Austen, HCS Occupational Therapist, presented a workshop for parents on Sensory Integration Disorder. She provided attendees with an overview of the disorder and used simulation strategies to set the context for a question and answer session where parents were able to share experiences with one another. Additionally, Marti provided practical strategies to support students in managing sensory dysfunction at home and in school. Thanks to Melissa Fisher for coordinating this important and informative session.

5.<u>Report from Lower and Middle School Principal</u>

The Professional Development Book Club sessions are wrapping up with this Thursday's book share out through which the five groups will present to one another salient points and techniques from their text of study and groups will pose questions regarding pedagogy to the faculty to discuss and consider. Group members have been implementing techniques from their text of study into practice and will share their experiences with their peers as well while making recommendations.

The next several sessions of professional development will revolve around PARCC readiness. Several of our faculty members and administrators have attended PARCC trainings throughout the school year, and the information that has been gathered is being turnkeyed in an ongoing way but will be more intensified in the weeks leading up to initial implementation in March. HCS has applied to pilot diagnostic assessments in math and language arts and is awaiting confirmation as to if we have been selected as a pilot school.

The K-8 students participated in a Pep Rally coordinated by Kevin Flynn, Matt Persico and student government participants. The "pep band" and DJ Persico kept the crowd dancing.

The Holiday Concert was a success with students from grades K-8 performing for the HCS community.

During the week of January 19-January 23, students will be participating in "No Name-Calling Week"/"Kindness Week" through school-wide activities led by the student government. "No Name Calling Week" is sponsored by the national organization GLSEN (Gay, Lesbian, and Straight Education Network). No Name-Calling Week was inspired by the popular young adult novel entitled The Misfits by author James Howe. The book tells the story of four best

friends trying to survive the seventh grade in the face of all too frequent taunts based on their weight, height, intelligence, and sexual orientation/gender expression.

Our focus at HCS will revolve around celebrating kindness through the theme of a "Kindness Garden" in conjunction with our school-wide anti-bullying efforts. Student government participants will be taking on leadership roles by handing out HCS stickers to all students on the first day of the sponsored week, visiting each classroom to complete a Kindness Garden Activity with all students which will be displayed by the main office and by making a daily announcement relating to kindness each morning on the morning announcements. Additionally, teachers will be teaching lessons in their classrooms helping students make age-appropriate connections to being kind to others.

The 5th grade, in an effort to promote kindness, is starting an "Acts of Kindness" campaign. Each week, students will pick a name out of a bucket, and they will perform an act of kindness for that person at some point during the week. Students can choose acts of kindness from a list of ideas they are getting and will be posted on the wall via an anchor chart. They can choose something they feel comfortable doing, and they have all week to find a time to do something genuine. Each morning, a quote will be projected on the board related to kindness to remind them of the campaign.

6.<u>Report from Upper School Principal</u>

- 1. Innovations
 - a) Mr. Eves' and Mr. Maurizi's Urban Agriculture classes have been featured on the New Jersey Charter School Association's blog and twitter feed. Arthur Eves guest wrote a blog featuring some of the innovative things that they have been working on in their Urban Agriculture class.
- 2. Service and Service Learning
 - a) As part of our students' senior project, the students have been meeting and working with Ms. Septimus, the Upper School Service Learning coordinator, and their senior advisory mentors with regards to the seniors' service learning projects.
 - b) Ms. Septimus' Arts Bridge cooking class meets weekly at the local shelter. While there, the students cook, clean, and visit with the staff and local citizens.
 - c) In partnership with the Jubilee Center of Hoboken, Ms. Reyes and Ms. Bollhardt spearheaded the "Giving Tree – Toy Drive" drive. The Upper School students and staff members collected over thirty gifts to be donated to under-privileged children. The gifts were presented to the Jubilee Center on December 19th.

The month of December showed the carry over of the 75,000 insurance claim for extra expense (unspent) and the receipt the State Adjustment Aid for the second quarter. This accounts for the

apparent surplus. The renewal of the insurance plan with a higher rate has not occurred yet in December. Maverick Building Service has finally submitted the balance of fingerprinting from the State. Finally, the first notice from the State shows a reduction in projected PERS payment for this year. Last year they changed the calculation at the last minute. The school may save from \$10,000-\$20,000 this year.
