4. <u>Report from K-12 Executive Director</u>

This yearøs EMPTY BOWLS event raised \$6,862.11 in cash and foodstuffs for the Hoboken Homeless Shelter, the Emergency Food Pantry, and the St. Matt's Noontime Lunch Ministry. We are VERY proud of all involved, particularly our committed students -- especially our 4th grade Empty Bowls ambassadors who acted as "hosts."

The HCS Board of Trustees spent a morning at the HCS Upper School to see a snapshot of a Day in the Life of a student. This provided an opportunity to meet with the principal as well as see classes in action led by our talented instructors.

5. <u>Report from Lower and Middle School Principal</u>

The 1st grade hosted a Recycled/Reseen Art Fair on June 1st, and the 2ndgrade hosted theirs on June 4th.The 4thgrade Art & Artists students will be coming in costume and character on June 9th as the artists they have studied to participate in an "ArtistsøBirthday Party" where they also bring a self-created gift for an artist studied to visually reflect their knowledge of a given artist. The 5/6 and 7/8 "Pictures of a Floating World" classes will be professionally publishing a book of their haiku, tanga and renga illustrated with their Sumi-e illustrations. The 5/6 and 7/8 "Joy of Paper" Artsbridge classes hosted guest artist Chuck Miley to see his pop-up books and learn how to create more complex paper engineered pop-ups.

HCS 6th graders gathered in the gym at the campus of Stevens Institute of Technology to save the world from Toxic Popcorn, build Tall Towers and launch Bottle Rockets during a STEM-a-thon: A Day of Innovation for Hoboken¢s 6th graders at <u>The Stevens Institute of Technology</u>. Stevens and <u>Hoboken Family Alliance</u> invited all 11 middle-schools in Hoboken to this unique, historic event for Hoboken. õOne of the key goals of this event is to engage and inspire Hoboken¢s budding scientists and engineers in the fun and excitement of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics,ö said Dr. Nariman Farvardin, president of Stevens Institute of Technology. õSTEM is everywhere, in iPhones and video games, in medical advances and in innovations that make our City more secure and resilient in future storms like Hurricane Sandy. We hope that many of the students who attend the STEM-a-thon will consider pursuing STEM degrees and careers.ö

Summer Gathering was a success this year with students from across grades K-8 performing music from popular films under the direction of Sean Gavarny. The HCS Middle School band participated in its first band competition which was a success. All three ensembles earned an "Excellent" rating and earned trophies for the school!

Classes across grades K-8 are participating in publishing parties where they showcase their written work to their families and peers. The middle school science fair is also coming up where all middle school students have an opportunity to share their experiments and findings.



 $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ grades are collaborating on an animal service learning project. They have collected recyclable materials to make dog and cat toys and are working with a local shelter to raise money for additional food. They will be selling their student made products while practicing math, reading, and writing skills along the way.

3rd grade also had a visit from the Hoboken C.E.R.T. team about how to respond in case of extreme weather in Hoboken. Students were given information on how to be prepared at home for an emergency. This links to the Extreme Weather science unit that they started in preparation for Empty Bowls. 3rd grade is also having a famous author come in to talk to 3rd and 4th grade about the writing process. Patricia Larkin (author of the Steve Jobs biography and more) will come in on Monday, June 8th. She will also swing by 1st grade to read one of her picture books with them.

6. <u>Report from Upper School Principal</u>

As part of our studentsø senior project, the students have been meeting and working with Ms. Septimus, the Upper School Service Learning Coordinator, and their senior advisory mentors with regards to the seniorsø service learning projects.

Upper School Student Ambassadors attended the õTeens Talk about Racism (TTAR)ö conference on May 28th. TTAR is a leadership conference for high school youth who want to collaborate to create strategies to understand and stand up to racism in their schools and communities. In a supportive atmosphere, teens with a desire to explore, collaborate and lead school diversity work come together to acquire the awareness, knowledge and skills to help improve interracial communication, make new friends and celebrate diversity. Our students had the opportunity to lead discussions, share music and collaborate on plans that have had a positive impact on their everyday lives.

Arthur Eves, Sean Maurizi, and Elizabeth Paredes took a group of 19 9th ó 11th graders on a week-long experiential learning trip to Star Island (off the coast of Portsmouth NH).

On May 22nd, the HCS-Upper School held its annual end-of-the year formal dance. This dance was the culmination of the Upper Schooløs spirit week. This sold-out event was held at HOPES and was enjoyed by all.

On May 13, forty-two students from across Hudson County were recognized for their academic excellence at the 28th Annual Hudson County Academic Achievement Recognition Program. Dimyana Shonoda and Mariam Ahmed of HCS Upper School were two of those honored.

Ms. Allison Addona, Upper School English teacher, has been accepted into the *Performance at the Center* program at Teachers College, Columbia University. As part of this summer fellowship, Ms. Addona will join twenty-three other exceptional teachers and students from around the world to re-conceptualize, re-vision, and re-create Kafkaøs *Metamorphosis* for the stage. The capstone of the summer institute will be a public performance at the black box theater on the Columbia campus. After the performance, the institute will extend an additional week to assist the program

recipients in translating their experiences into a workable classroom curriculum and ultimately a proposal for the national conference hosted at Teachers College in the spring.

On May 26th and 27th, the Upper Schooløs 10th and 11th graders took the New Jersey Biology Competency Test (NJBCT). The NJBCT is administered to measure a studentøs knowledge and understanding of the 2009 NJCCCS in Science. All of the Upper Schooløs Biology curricula are aligned to the NJCCCS and instructional practices and assessment pieces are geared to promote student acquisition of the knowledge and skills needed to be successful on the NJBCT.
