4. Report from K-12 Executive Director

In the month of October, the Upper School celebrated Hispanic Heritage Month highlighting a famous Hispanic person every day. To end this celebration, Upper School Spanish teacher Tamar Reyes went to the Kindergarten class and read them a book entitled *Smart about Art: Frida Kahlo: The Artist Who Painted Herself* by Margaret Frith. She facilitated a conversation about who Frida Kahlo was and how she was not afraid to express who she was through her self-portraits. (This built upon self-portraiture work K students had completed with K teachers, Courtney Salerno and Ashley Hartpence.) Ms. Reyes taught the students the phrase "Yo soy..." and had them highlight positive traits about themselves such as physical and personality traits. Ms. Reyes remarked in how thrilled she was in hearing them highlight such positive words like bonita, inteligente, excelente, feliz and simpática.

HOBOKEN CHARTER SCHOOL

A K - 12 SERVICE LEARNING SCHOOL

The school continues its work in preparing for the charter renewal site visit later this month, November 22. An email was sent out to parents requesting participants to be interviewed by the renewal team, and a team has since been selected to share their experiences at HCS. Requested documents are being compiled to share with the NJDOE team. We look forward to meeting with the team and receiving valuable feedback on our program.

5. Report from Lower and Middle School Administration

School Violence Awareness Week is celebrated annually by all schools in New Jersey during the third week of October. Teachers identified an activity for their class related to awareness of school violence by: promoting respect and tolerance of others, learning how to resolve conflicts peacefully and supporting safety inside and outside of school.

On October 20, the Lower and Middle Schools hosted their first Open House event. Many interested families from Hoboken and Jersey City attended the event to learn more about both the Lower and Middle School programs. Teachers from the respective grade bands met with families to explain components of the instructional and extracurricular programs as well as to provide tours of the school.

On October 24, the Lower and Middle Schools kicked off the schoolwide service learning initiative for the year on Make A Difference Day. This year's theme is "...And Justice For All," focusing on the intersection of legal and social issues. Each class will spend the year researching and reenacting a historic legal case that has had an impact on social justice. Members of the Student Government spoke regarding the upcoming cases and the keynote address was given by attorney and HCS parent Heidi Conlin. The Fuzzy Lemons performed several Schoolhouse Rock songs to celebrate the day.

The autumn iteration of the Green Ambassadors Program, under the leadership of Spanish teacher Ms. Diaz, has kicked off for the 2016-2017 school year. The program takes place at the Riverview Community Garden in Jersey City and provides students interested in doing community service an opportunity to engage in environmental issues and learn about fall and winter gardening. Students participate in a variety of activities as a Green Ambassador, including: planting, watering, weeding, giving tours and general maintenance.

Led by Lower School advisor Ms. Mercandetti, the Lower School founded its Student Government Association (SGA) in November and held its first elections for K-3 homeroom representatives and fourth grade officers on Election Day. The Lower School SGA will work in collaboration with the Middle and Upper School SGAs to support student-led initiatives at HCS.

Several of our Lower and Middle School classes have participated in experiential field trips outside of the classroom:

- Grade K visited a farm for apple and pumpkin picking
- Grades 1-2 visited the Tenafly Nature Center
- Grade 2 visited the Turtleback Zoo
- Grade 5 visited the Museum of Mathematics

On November 18th, the Upper School's 9th – 11th grade young women will be participating in the Young Women's Leadership Conference at Montclair State University.

On November 16th, some of our Upper School students will be attending a performance by Michael Indorato entitled "The Flying Artist".

As part of the Upper School's commitment to the Hoboken community and service learning, our upper school students will be cooking and volunteering on Wednesdays (for the rest of the academic year) at the Hoboken Shelter.

In recognition of November being Lung Cancer Awareness Month, Interact is selling bracelets. All proceeds generated from this sale will be donated to Lungevity.

Our Upper School students will be assisting with the Hoboken Senior Center's "Walk the Walk" event. This event is held the day before Thanksgiving, and the student will be assisting with the cooking, serving, and cleaning up after the event.

As part of the Hoboken Studio Artist Tour, our Upper School students had their work displayed at the Hoboken library and had an exhibit at the Hoboken City Hall (which will run through the month of November).
