5. Report from K-12 Executive Director

Upper School Teacher Cadets have begun their work with lower and middle school classrooms and have jumped right in to supporting teachers in their work in the classroom. In the first weeks, they will be getting acclimated with the class, teacher and class rules and providing support. Ultimately, they will apply what they have learned in their coursework as well and lead small group work and full lessons. We appreciate their enthusiasm as well as the time the K-8 teachers are giving to serve as mentors to these students.

On January 12th, Hoboken Charter School hosted its 19th lottery. The event was well attended, and families received notification the following day. We are eager to meet all of our new families.

6. Report from Lower and Middle School Administration

Middle School math teacher Chris Kunkel and music teacher Sean Gavarny were nominated for the LifeChanger of the Year Award. Mr. Kunkel and Mr. Gavarny were nominated by HCS parents for their hard work and dedication. The finalists will be selected in January and will receive cash prizes for themselves and their schools. In addition, there is a spirit award for the school and nominee whose community shows the most support for their nomination.

During the month of December, Ms. Swentzel's first graders collected toiletry kits to donate to the Hoboken Shelter. Over 100 kits were collected, in addition to other supplies and food. The first graders carried the kits over to the shelter on December 21.

On December 7, 2016, the sixth through eighth grade "Girls Who Code" club met with 26 third through fifth grade girls after school for an "Hour of Code" event. GWC members led a variety of activities from code.org. Also in December, GWC members Maya Espinel, Lucy Hartigan, Alma Madlener and Jo Conlon led "Hour of Code" sessions with first and second grade students during the school day.

On December 19, Student Government Advisors Mr. Persico and Ms. Mercandetti, along with Ms. Freylikhman conducted a peer mentor training session with the fourth grade student council officers, Middle School officers and a few other SGA representatives. Students were excited to begin the work and had many great ideas to share as the Lower and Middle Schools look to implement peer mentoring. The program will be rolled out this winter.

The Lower and Middle Schools held their annual pep rally on December 23, led by Mr. Flynn. Members of HCS clubs were recognized and the basketball teams were introduced. The Middle School jazz band played as well.

On January 3, forty-three Middle School students were celebrated for making the first trimester honor roll, with a 90% or above average in every class. Students joined Ms. Grode, Ms. Niesz and Ms. Fisher for a pizza lunch.

Several of our Lower and Middle School classes have participated in experiential field trips outside of the classroom:

- Grade 2 visited the Hoboken Historical Society
- The Girls Who Code Club went to see Hidden Figures - a movie about three African-American women at NASA
- Grade 7 and 8 Girls Who Code Club members went to Tween Tech Day at Drew University

7. Report from Upper School Administration

Deirdra Grode and Melissa Fisher brought the Tomorrow's Teachers class to Montclair State University on January 9th for a conference hosted by the university's Center of Pedagogy, College of Education and Human Services and the NJ Future Educators Association. Students listened to inspirational educators speak about their experiences and selected breakout sessions around areas of particular interest in education. Topics included: Reaching Every Child From Within, Jumpstart into Early Childhood, Discovering Your Education Swagger in Less than 60 Minutes, Apps and Technology for Learning in



the 21st Century, Using Psychology to Make you a Better Learner, Impact Over Income and Discovering the Mathematician within Them and You. Students also had an opportunity to hear from Montclair students about the transition from high school to college. Montclair reps were also available to meet with interested students.

As part of the Upper School’s capstone service-learning project, the seniors have been meeting with their senior project advisors.

On Thursday, January 12th, the Upper School staff participated in a drug and alcohol awareness workshop. This workshop focused on educating our students on positive lifestyle choices and in helping our staff to better understand and recognize the signs of drug and alcohol use.

As part of the Upper School’s commitment to service learning, various staff members have designed classroom experiences focused on MLK on the schoolwide theme of “And Justice For All”.
