9. K-12 Report

On June 11, the K-12 faculty presented work they engaged students in this school year via mission-aligned practices to their peers. There were opportunities to ask questions and provide feedback. This annual cross-grade share is an excellent opportunity for our teachers and staff to celebrate and learn from one another –particularly around SJE and SL. The event followed with the annual end of year party which was held virtually this year. The Sunshine Committee presented awards to all K-12 faculty and staff which may become a new HCS tradition. It was a fun afternoon of sharing, learning and celebrating.

The HCS administration continues to stay informed on guidance from the State as well as from other states and agencies to begin planning for the 2020-2021 school year. Additionally, the administration continues to plan for the move of the upper school from the temporary sites to ultimately our shared campus.

A moving video montage was created by the Sunshine Committee thanking Maria Nunez for her twenty years of service to HCS. Videos from staff, students, alumni and parents were included.

10. Lower/Middle School Report

On Thursday, May 21, HCS hosted a virtual move up day. Students in grades K-4 and 6 met with their teachers for next year.

On June 2-3, HCS hosted its first virtual talent show. Students submitted videos playing instruments, singing, dancing, doing magic, telling jokes and other talents. Thank you to Mr. Gavarny for organizing this event in place of summer gathering.



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First grade students have been working hard on creating a realistic fiction book series consisting of four books. Students have been presenting one of their books to the class virtually during the week of June 8.

Through virtual art classes, Mr. Duff has had students participate in the "Getty Challenge" of recreating famous works of art with household items. HCS has been submitting entries to the program.

On June 16, the eighth grade class participated in a virtual commencement ceremony followed by a reception with staff.

11. Upper School Report

Teachers have continued to be innovative and flexible during online learning. Elective Week was well received and students seemed to enjoy engaging in different types of learning. Opportunities for community connections were also continued through class events and lunch chats. Social worker, Heather DeSimone, and Ben Gonzalez supported the Student Social Justice Ambassadors as they hosted a discussion about recent events and protests.

Seniors were gifted with a celebratory yard sign, a senior t-shirt, and a gift bag with snacks and a gift card. Staff worked to create a video with messages from Board President, Lauren Calmas, and State Senator Cory Booker, as well as personal messages for each senior. This shared on the last day of school with our seniors and their families.

We continue communication with the City of Hoboken and the Office of Emergency Management to design a modified in-person graduation aligned with requirements set forth by the NJDOE. We hope to announce the plan and date soon.
