### K-12 Report

On January 16, in honor and celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., K-12 students marched while singing songs of freedom and justice (despite the cold weather) to City Hall carrying signs of protest and inspiration around issues of import to them. These signs were made in collaboration between the lower and upper schools. Leading up to the March, students explored the life and legacy of Dr. King, civil rights and historical and contemporary movements to address civil rights concerns. Student speakers from each division spoke to the school about why they marched, and Mayor Ravi Bhalla shared a proclamation from the City.

In advance of the school's January 16<sup>th</sup> lottery, members of the charter schools in Hoboken partnered with the City and HHA for an outreach event through which families could enjoy a holiday party with food, beverages and gifts. At this event, Hoboken Charter School shared information about the school and its weighted lottery and helped families complete applications.

Hoboken Charter School held its annual lottery on January 16, 2019 with its highest number of applicants in school history

### **Lower/Middle School Report**

Hoboken Charter School fourth graders raised an incredible \$8,396.71 for the Leukemia &



Lymphoma Society through a powerful service-learning experience they engaged in under the leadership of Jen Tarangelo, 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher. Tonight, these inspiring students will share about their experience.

Throughout the fall, a number of the middle school students were working on solving online coding challenges and four of them went on to compete in the Cyber Robotics Coding Competition in person last month to compete in four challenges. HCS finished in fourth place in the mid-Atlantic region and HCS was invited to send two teams to the finals. Additionally, two middle school girls were recognized for being two of just forty-four students in the region (out of a few thousand) to complete all the coding challenges.

### **Upper School Report**

We started the New Year with a pep rally in support of our basketball and cheer teams. Teams were introduced and helped to lead fun games and competitions. The Juniors carried away every win but the Seniors won for spirit and the Staff team gave them serious competition in the free throw challenge!

We began a new tradition by hosting an Alumni Lunch in January. Seven members from the Classes of 2018 and 2019 took time out from Penn State, Rutgers University, Keystone College, St. Peter's University, Bloomfield College, and following their passions in full time jobs to share some advice with our current juniors and seniors. The alumni recommended that students finish high school strong and take school seriously. They discussed the pros and cons of living in a dorm and going away to college. They made recommendations about finding a balance in life after high school and how to find support when needed. Staff also met with the alumni separately to gather information about how best to support students in the transition from HCS.

The Upper School welcomed speaker Nathan Harmon, brought to us by Hunter's World. Hunter's World is an organization working to build a peer mentoring group among high school teens in order to create an environment in which they feel safe to discuss and manage their mental health and emotional stability. Hoboken Charter Upper School students who are involved with this organization helped to lead the daylong event.

Before the end of 2019, the Sophomores engaged in a community building activity designed by the school social worker and Upper School principal. The leaders that emerged from this will be ambassadors to the 4<sup>th</sup> grade and are helping to plan a similar experience with those students.

Mid January also included testing at the Upper School. All classes took Star360 assessments to provide mid year data used by staff to monitor growth as well as screen for needs. Select students took the NJSLA Fall Block assessments in in ELA and Math.

Juniors and Seniors worked with their class advisors to plan and host a Winter Wonderland school dance as a fundraiser for class events.

Our Seniors have worked all year with our College and Career Counselor and decisions are starting to come in. They report acceptances to William Paterson University, Seton Hall University, St. Peter's University, NJCU, Montclair State University, and Bloomfield College. We expect many more in the next few months!
