VI. Finance

Whereas, as a result of the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) pandemic, which has created a public health, economic, and educational crisis, Congress adopted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), which included the Paycheck Protection Program (“PPP”), administered by the United States Small Business Administration (“SBA”); and

Whereas, Hoboken Charter School is eligible to receive a loan under the rules of the SBA in effect at the time its application was submitted implementing the Paycheck Protection Program; and

Whereas, upon information provided by and recommendation of the school business administrator, the Board of Trustees finds that current economic uncertainty exists which makes this loan request necessary to support the ongoing operations of the school;

Whereas, examples of economic uncertainty include, but are not limited to:

- reduction in State Charter Aid
- tax revenue shortfalls from municipalities in this fiscal year 2020,
- late State Aid Payments beginning in fiscal year 2021; and
- delayed tax revenue from municipalities during your 2021 fiscal year; and

Whereas, New Jersey Charter schools do not have the ability to raise revenues from taxes;

Whereas, the funds will be used to retain workers and maintain payroll or make mortgage interest payments, lease payments, utility payments and other expenses authorized as specified under PPP rules; and

Now therefore, be it RESOLVED, that the Hoboken Charter School Board of Trustees accepts and approves the PPP loan through Bank of America in the amount of \$655,543.
